## 2 About FirstClass Synchronization Services

FirstClass Synchronization Services (FCSS) provides ActiveSync interfaces for FirstClass systems. ActiveSync is a industry standard protocol supported by a wide variety of handheld devices and desktop applications as a way to synchronize important user data such as calendar events, contacts, and tasks between a server and those devices/applications.

FirstClass Synchronization Services 12.1.009 includes the following new features.

#### 2.1.1 Added HTTP Information Feature

Admin can now query Sync Server via a HTTP browser and obtain various settings info for the server.

- A WSGI compliant web server. For ease of install and configuration this beta release will
  install and use a CherryPy web server. An Apache web server can also be used, but needs
  the mod\_wsgi module installed / configured along with additional configuration which will
  follow this release.
- The FirstClass Server you are logging into must be running version 12.0 B1303 or greater.

|            | Exceptions not supported (changing a single instance of a repeating event on the device)  |
|            | Windows Mobile devices can only connect to Sync Service with SSL enabled  |
|            | Windows Mobile does not currently support sub folders   |
|            | Full subcontainer sync support only available for Device 1 and 2 in user preferences - Handhelds Devices tab. Fixed in a future FC Server build |
